#### Funding Opportunities with Multiple Deadlines or no deadlines

These trusts accept applications all year round or have multiple deadlines, see websites for further details

<u>The Simon Shades Scholarship</u> The scholarship is an annual, merit-based competition. The goal of the scholarship is intended to help the winning candidate fund living expenses and/or tuition fees during their study. The scholarship is a onetime award of £1000. It is funded by The Brun Bear Foundation. Applications online via the website

<u>Vegetarian Charity</u> offers grants for vegetarian and vegan students of 25 years of age or younger. Grants are based on hardship. For further information please see the website

<u>Yorkshire Ladies' Council of Education</u> **Over 21's**: offers grants of up to £400 to support fees for British women of 21 years of age or over. It provides small awards to help British women who do not qualify for support from Student Finance. **However, women who are eligible for a Postgraduate Loan may apply.** 

<u>The Women's Careers Foundation</u> **Over 21's**: (Girls of The Realm Guild) Women only, who are UK citizens. Applicants should be seeking assistance to begin or continue studies for a career and should be 21 or over, except for music or dancing when the minimum age is 16. Grants are not given for PhD study or postgraduate studies if the subject indicates a complete change of direction. An SAE is essential. Applications should be submitted between the 1 September and 31 January for the following academic year

Ruby and Will George Trust Applicant must be able to demonstrate a family link with commerce (see website for useful examples). The Trust only makes grants that are for the enhancement of education or for the relief of poverty, depending on the individual's level of need.

<u>Funds for Women Graduates</u> The Foundation Grant scheme is intended to contribution only towards the living expenses of one year's academic study or research. Women graduates from Britain and overseas are eligible to apply they must be studying in Great Britain

<u>Daiwa Foundation Small Grants</u> can cover all fields of activity, including educational and grassroots exchanges, research travel, the organisation of conferences, exhibitions, and other projects and events that fulfil this broad objective. Applicants must be resident in either the UK or Japan and demonstrate a long-term commitment to UK-Japan relations. New initiatives are especially encouraged:

<u>The Gilchrist Educational Trust</u> Applications are considered from students who have made proper provision to fund a degree or higher education course but find themselves facing unexpected financial difficulties which may prevent completion of it; also, from students who are required, as part of their course, to spend a short period studying abroad. <u>The Masonic Charitable Foundation</u> can help freemasons or someone with a strong family connection to a previous or current freemason under the English Constitution. rants can support the cost of IT equipment, course materials, school uniforms and extracurricular activities for children

<u>Retail Trust award</u> You or a parent must have worked in retail. Educational grants can cover university costs for you or your dependants such as course fees and accommodation. Applicants must have a combined household income of no more than £50,000, and an individual income of no more than £30,000. Apply online.

#### May

<u>BAFTA UK Scholarship Programme</u> The BAFTA UK scholarship programme is open to British citizens in need of financial assistance to take eligible undergraduate and postgraduate courses in the UK. Each BAFTA Scholar receives up to £12,000 towards their annual course fees, as well as mentoring support from a BAFTA member, winner or nominee and free access to BAFTA events around the UK.

<u>1st Formations Business Scholarships</u> Scholarship awards up to 10 successful applicants with a bursary of £600 each. The bursary is designed to help students with some of the additional costs involved in studying, such as the cost of course materials, textbooks and other living expenses. Applicants must be able to demonstrate academic excellence, a desire to run a business and can demonstrate financial need. Not available to previous recipients of the 1<sup>st</sup> Formations Business Scholarship.

# August

<u>Masters Compare Scholarship</u> to apply register to receive the Masters Compare email newsletter, making sure to tick the 'Master's Scholarship draw' box on Masters Compare in order to be automatically entered. You are not eligible if you are continuing an existing master's course.

<u>Snowdon Trust</u> If you have a physical or sensory disability and are in further or higher education, you can apply to us for help with additional disability related costs that are not fully provided for by available statutory funding.

# September

<u>Postgrad Solutions Study Bursary</u> **Post Graduate:** The Bursary is worth £500. To apply complete the Postgrad Solutions Study Bursaries application form on the webpage. As well as your postgraduate course information, you need to provide is a 200-word piece about why you should receive one of the £500 bursaries. Payment of the award will be made direct to the institution, and will be discounted from your fees as appropriate.

### October

Oppenheim-John Downes Memorial Trust Over 30's: The awards are awarded to deserving artists of any kind who are unable effectively to pursue their vocation by reason of their financial difficulties. As a general guide the maximum award would be £1,000 but, in exceptional circumstances, the Trustees may consider making a larger award.
