	Applicants would normally be expected to have an Honours degree in a related subject area such as Fine Art, Illustration, Painting and Drawing, Sculpture, Graphics, Film, TV, Animation or Theatre. However, applicants with extensive relevant professional experience will also be considered. For speakers of English as a second language an IELTS 7.0 (International English Language Testing System) or equivalent is the minimum requirement with a minimum of 7.0 in each component of reading, writing, listening and speaking.
	The selection process is entirely through interview and consideration of a comprehensive portfolio of artwork. There are no interview fees.
Course outline:	This Masters level course provides students with advanced level skills and knowledge in scenic art such that they can be employed directly on completion of the course in high-end professional scenic art departments or as freelancers in the theatre, opera and animation industries. These skills include advanced level faux finishes, such as wood graining and marbling, how to manage and run a team from first production meeting through till full realisation, including costing, quantifying and all Health and Safety considerations. Advanced perspective drawing, scenically painting an Old Master, 3D carving and a wide range of techniques including textural finishes are covered. As such, this highly specialist course is unique in England in providing students with a learning environment within a conservatoire drama school, enabling their completed work as scenic artists to normally be seen on professional stages in Bristol or exhibited in a public art gallery or online. Students work closely with designers and other production departments learning collaborative, problem solving and creative interpretation skills. Their learning is in line with industry expectations which is further tested in a series of mock interviews with high level professionals and normally through an industry placement.
